Threats of violence are increasing in our society. This workshop will teach attendees a structured way to assess threats using the Comprehensive School Threat Assessment Guidelines (CSTAG). The model has many similarities to models used by federal law enforcement. While the CSTAG model is designed for schools, there are many applications of the model in private agencies, which are apparent during the training. The CSTAG model was created by Dr. Dewey Cornell at the University of Virginia and is the only evidence-based model in the National Registry of Evidence-Based Programs designed for school threat evaluation. Attendees are encouraged to attend in teams all from one school or agency. Individuals who attend alone will be placed in groups with other attendees to create teams. The six-hour workshop reviews cases of threatening behavior, so individuals who may have trauma reactions should be mindful of this content.

All attendees can obtain a CSTAG completion certificate upon the workshop's conclusion. Please note that an additional fee of \$50 is <u>required</u> if you want to register for this all-day workshop, regardless of whether you do not want the certificate.
